Room 18, Grade 2**

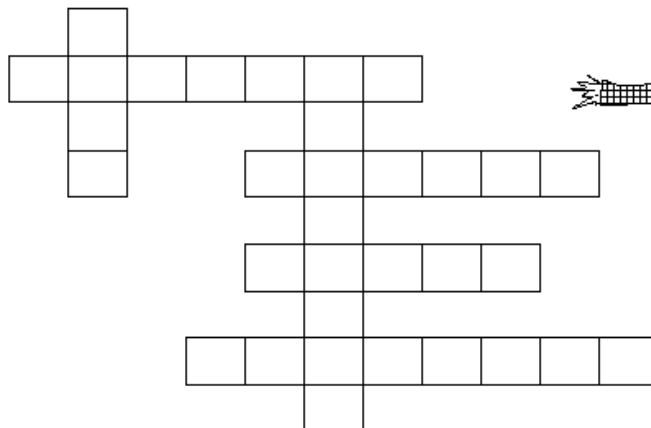
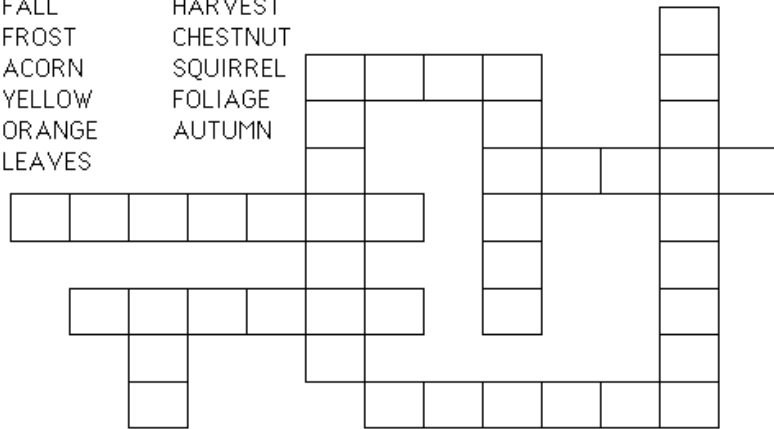

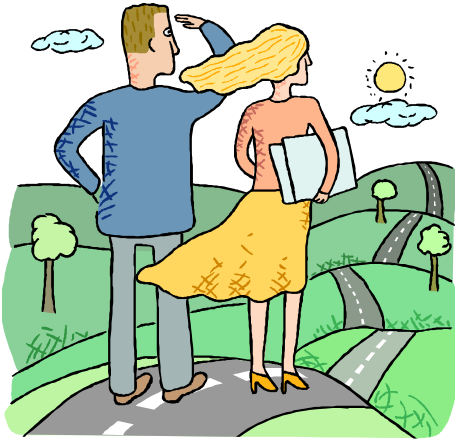
Even more classroom news.....
