A. The first time they heard America sneeze!

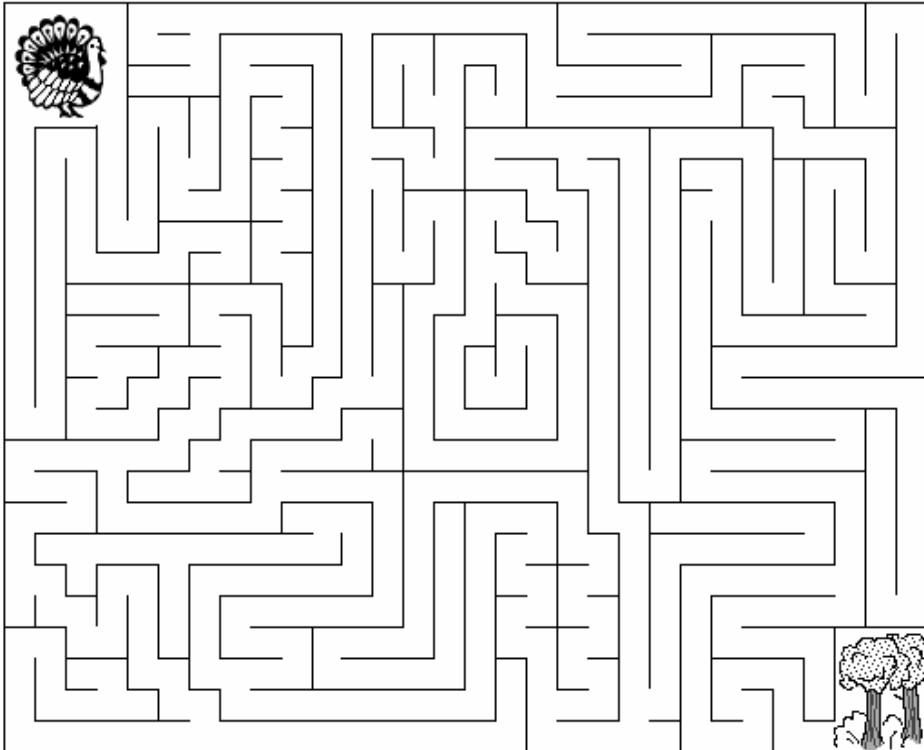

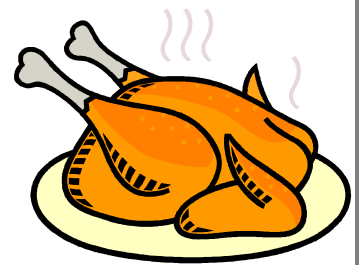
Help the turkey escape into the woods
